### **Welcome and Call Meeting to Order**

Chair Diane Rondini welcomed commissioners to the meeting. Chair Rondini announced WisEye is streaming the GJJC meeting today and asked commissioners and other attendees to introduce themselves.

Quorum was present. Chair Rondini requested a motion to approve the May 14, 2024, GJJC Meeting Minutes.

### **Subcommittee Sharing**

Ethnic and Racial Disparities (ERD) Subcommittee – Commissioner Edjron Pearson reported the DOJ Staff is developing presentation materials to be used with the R-ED Juvenile Deflection and Diversion factsheet. The Commissioners commented they look forward to sharing the factsheet with the public. The DOJ Staff reported the R-ED Deflection and Diversion factsheet, and the Wisconsin R/ED Summary factsheet are posted on the GJJC Resource webpage. DOJ staff shared

that they presented 2023 disparities data to the subcommittee and confirmed action items to be included in the 2024 Racial and Ethnic Disparities Reduction Plan.

<u>Policy, Legislation and Compliance (PLC) Subcommittee</u> – Commissioner Carl Ashley acknowledged the staff incident at Lincoln Hills School and expressed his and the Commission's support for our partners at the Department of Corrections. Commissioner Ashley reported the discussion of POSC and the Mandt Systems is tabled at this time and may be revisited in the future once more information about the methods is available. Commissioner Ashley reported the Executive Subcommittee has been discussing changing the name of the Commission to Governor's Youth Justice Commission and the steps involved in changing the Commission's name.

<u>Youth Voice Commission (YVC)</u> – Kiley Komro reported the YVC is meeting on Mondays instead of Wednesdays. At the last meeting, there was a presentation on Wisconsin's Juvenile Justice System and the members discussed a survey that is for youth in out of home placements. Komro also reported Commissioner Aidan Raney is now the chair of the Youth Voice Commission.

Komro reported the GJJC Executive Subcommittee approved a new payment plan for youth participating in GJJC activities. The youth will now be paid per hour instead of per meeting. Komro also reported a new payment system that will reimburse the youth in a timely manner.

### **DOJ Updates**

<u>DOJ Staff</u> – Matt Allord reported Jess Reindl started as the Compliance Monitor and R/ED Coordinator. Reindl introduced herself to the Commission.

<u>Compliance Update</u> – Allord reported he will provide an annual compliance report later in the meeting.

<u>Legislation</u> – Sabrina Gentile reported the Joint Finance Committee approved the Mendota Juvenile Treatment Center (MJTC) funding for 124 positions, estimated to cost about \$12 million. The funding will Increase beds from 29 to 94. Funding was held up for 6 months.

Commissioner Hermes reported hiring new employees and then training will need to happen before more youth are admitted to MJTC.

Gentile reported DOC 374 and 376 draft rules have been submitted to the legislative standing committees. The standing committees may choose to hold a public hearing. Commissioner Hermes provided additional information on the administrative rules process.

<u>Grants</u> – Komro provided a summary of completed and on-going Title II subgrants in advance of the meeting. Komro reviewed the report for the Commission.

### Wisconsin Department of Corrections (DOC) Updates

### Ron Hermes, Administrator of Juvenile Corrections and Commissioner designee

Commissioner Ron Hermes reported there were 37 boys at Lincoln Hills School and 13 girls at Copper Lake School. Commissioner Lesley Chapin provided updated numbers and reported 42 boys and 13 girls at the facility as of August 13, 2024. Commissioner Hermes acknowledged the number of girls has increased. Commissioner Hermes also provided residency information for the girls. Commissioner Hermes shared information about DJC at a glance which provides publicly available data about youth at the DJC. Commissioner Hermes responded to questions from other commissioners and confirmed that training and psychological support is provided to staff and youth.
